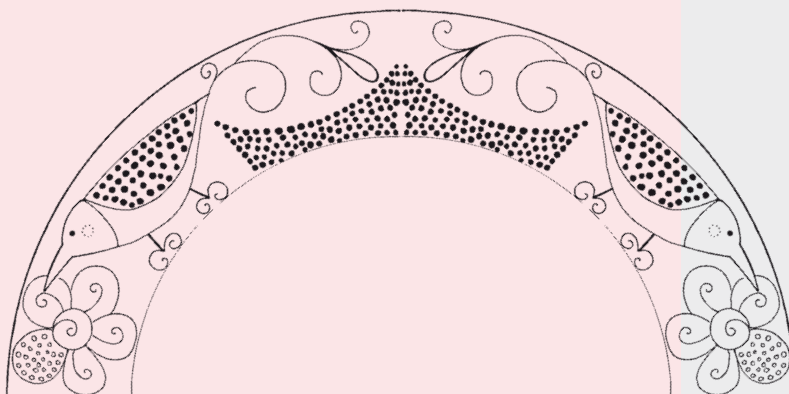


Glass painting is so easy: using Glass Painters is as simple as using a pen.

Degree of difficulty 1 2 3

To tear off, take away and collect





From Marabu you will need...

- Glass Painter in pink (404), yellow (420), cherry red (431), dark blue (453), light green (463)
- glass plate (434), Ø 35 cm

... you will also need:

- masking tape or adhesive tape
- scissors

Here's how it's done

1. Photocopy the semi-circular motif twice and enlarge to the size of the rim of the plate. Cut out both semi-circles and stick together to form a circle.
2. Fix the circle motif under the rim of the plate. Clean the rim of the plate so that the surface is grease- and dust-free (e.g. with alcohol-based spirit or window cleaner) and start painting the birds: trace the outlines and fill in the breasts in light green. Then add the beaks and the flower outlines with yellow. Decorate the wings with yellow dots and paint the feet in yellow too.
3. Allow painted areas to dry before you add more decoration. For example, the bodies of the birds can be outlined with pink dots, or the yellow petals decorated with red dots. There are no limits to your imagination. Allow the painting to dry for approx. 4 hours.

Fixing:

Bake for 30 min. in a cold oven set at 170°C and allow to cool down in the closed oven. Your creations are dishwasher-safe after baking.

Tips:

Shake well before first use with the cap closed. Then press down onto the tip repeatedly for a short time until the ink is visible.
